Raise the Roof Update

Last year, the congregation voted to invest in the future of our building, and therefore our ministry by making some necessary and expensive repairs to the roof and the to the interior damage that was caused by the roof issues. A \$15,000 loan was secured from the synod, with the understanding that through intentional directed giving, we would repay that loan. In 2021, \$7,045 was repaid by the congregation. As of April of 2022, \$1,370 was additionally paid. We thank those who donated money toward this campaign and encourage everyone to continue contributing toward the repayment of this loan and other future property needs.

Hope...A Walk Through Time

•Hope Lutheran Church was started as a Chapel project of Trinity Lutheran Church on April 19, 1885. Hope was one of the three chapels started at the time. The other two were Peace and Faith.

•The cornerstone for the Hope Chapel, located on Schuylkill Avenue, was laid on May 21, 1885. The building was dedicated on September 20, 1885 with a construction cost of \$2,100.00. This building still stands today, and remains a church.

Feeding Others

Hope's Pantry continues to provide food to over 250 families each month. This ministry has not missed a beat, even throughout the pandemic. Volunteers from the congregation as well as the community (often including some Reading Police Officers) work to serve those who struggle with food insecurities. Helping Harvest (formerly the Berks Food Bank) provides the food, free of charge, and the West Berks Mission District provides for the delivery of the food to Hope. We are thankful for all of our many partners in ministry.
